Artists in the Bush is an initiative of Gippsland Lakes Community Health (GLCH), developed in partnership with the Bruthen Primary School and DSE. This project was established to encourage local residents of Bruthen and visiting tourists to revisit the Bruthen walking trails located on the outskirts of the township of Bruthen.

“Over the past 13 weeks, grade 5 and 6 students have worked with health promotion staff from GLCH to create art works inspired by the ‘Magic Loop’ trail. The artwork consists of mono-prints, sculptures and logo’s designed and printed on flags,” explained Andrea Farley, health promotion worker at GLCH.
